Influenza or "the flu" is a respiratory illness caused by a virus. It is very easy to catch and can make people very unwell. The flu is different from the common cold or a stomach bug. Outbreaks of the flu virus usually occur in the autumn and winter months. A new flu vaccine is available each year because the flu virus changes from year to year.
